



### What is Mounjaro KwikPen?

Mounjaro KwikPen (tirzepatide) is a medication used in addition to diet and exercise to improve blood sugar control for the treatment of adult patients with type 2 diabetes mellitus. It works by mimicking two natural hormones (GLP-1 and GIP) in the body to reduce your appetite and make you feel fuller, helping you maintain a reduced calorie diet.

### How to Take Mounjaro KwikPen

- Comes in a multidose pre-filled, disposable pen.
- Injected under the skin once a week (stomach, thigh, or upper arm).
- Start with 2.5mg per week and gradually increase the dose every 4 weeks as directed by your doctor.
- Always inject on the same day each week. It can be taken at any time of day, regardless of meals.
- If you miss a dose by less than 4 days, take it as soon as possible. If more than 4 days have passed, skip the dose and continue as usual.

### Common Side Effects

**> 10% OF PATIENTS:**

Nausea, diarrhea, constipation, vomiting, decreased appetite.

**1 TO 10% OF PATIENTS:**

Stomach pain, indigestion, dizziness, fatigue, injection-site reactions.

**<1% OF PATIENTS:**

Pancreatitis, slow stomach emptying, intestinal blockage, severe allergic reactions (anaphylaxis, angioedema), kidney injury.

### Common Drug Interactions:

- Insulin or sulfonylureas (may increase the risk of low blood sugar).
- Medications that may increase heart rate. (ex. stimulants)
- Oral birth control pills (effectiveness may be reduced; consider alternative methods).



### How to Store Mounjaro KwikPen

- Store in the refrigerator (2°C to 8°C).
- Can be kept at room temperature (≤30°C or ≤ 86°F) for up to 30 days.
- Do not freeze or use if frozen.
- Store in the original carton to protect from light and heat.
- Use each pen only as directed and dispose of used pens in a sharps disposal container.



### IMPORTANT WARNING

- May increase the risk of certain thyroid tumors (found in animals, not confirmed in people).

### Who Should **NOT** Take Mounjaro KwikPen?

- If you are allergic to any ingredients in Mounjaro.
- If you or a family member has had a history of thyroid cancer, or a condition called MEN 2.
- If you have type 1 diabetes ((Mounjaro is NOT a replacement for insulin).
- If you have serious stomach problems.
- If you are pregnant or breastfeeding.
